# **PROCEDURAL MATTERS**

Prior to the hearing the protest committee clarified in accordance with RRS 64.1(c) that the hearing request was not only a request for redress but also a protest and proceeded with it accordingly.

### **FACTS FOUND**

- 1. The wind was 15-18 kts.
- 2. Hoefle Haus and C-Tech were sailing upwind on starboard tack approximately 3 minutes before the start of Race 6.
- 3. *C-Tech* bore away to a starboard downwind course at approximately 8-10 knots of boat speed, and several seconds later *Hoefle Haus* also bore away to a starboard downwind course.
- 4. C-Tech was to windward and overlapped.
- 5. The boats were approximately 3-5 boatlengths apart.
- 6. The boats remained on this point of sail for a few seconds.
- 7. C-Tech gybed to port tack and to a collision course with Hoefle Haus.
- 8. Hoefle Haus bore away burying the bow and slowing the boat, but there was insufficient room to change course to avoid C-Tech.
- 9. 3-5 seconds later a collision occurred between the spinnaker pole of *Hoefle Haus* and the port side of *C-Tech* causing serious damage.
- 10. C-Tech attempted to luff but there was insufficient room to luff to avoid Hoefle Haus.
- 11. C-Tech retired due to the damage.
- 12. Hoefle Haus did not take a penalty but sailed and finished the restarted race.

## **CONCLUSIONS AND RULES THAT APPLY**

Rules: 10, 11, 14, 62.1

- 1. When both boats were on starboard gybe, C-Tech was to windward and keep clear boat under RRS 11.
- 2. When C-Tech gybed to port she remained keep clear boat under RRS 10.
- 3. C-Tech on port failed to keep clear of Hoefle Haus on starboard, and broke RRS 10.
- 4. C-Tech did not avoid contact when it was reasonably possible, and broke RRS 14.
- 5. It was not reasonably possible for *Hoefle Haus*, the right-of-way boat to avoid contact with *C-Tech* when it was clear that *C-Tech* was not keeping clear. *Hoefle Haus* did not break RRS 14.
- 6. *C-Tech*'s place in race 6 was made worse through her own fault. Therefore, the requirements for redress in RRS 62.1 are not met.
