PROCEDURAL MATTERS

1. The panel is constituted according to RRS N1.4(b)

2. Joanna Macalister attended the hearing as an observer.

FACTS FOUND

- 1. The wind speed was 13-15 knots in race no. 10 of the RS Tera.
- 2. GBR 2642 was sailing on starboard tack on a close-hauled course.
- 3. GBR 1885 was sailing on port tack on a close-hauled course.
- 4. Both were on a collision course.
- 5. At a distance of 0.5-1.0 meter GBR 2642 luffed and passed head to wind.
- 6. There was contact between the port side of GBR 2642 and the starboard side of GBR 1885 at the last quarter of the
- 7. GBR 1885 took a one-turn penalty directly after the incident.
- 8. There was neither damage or injury.

CONCLUSIONS AND RULES THAT APPLY

Rules: 10, 14, 44.1, SI 16.2

- 1. GBR 1885 on port failed to keep clear of GBR 2642 on starboard, and broke RRS 10.
- 2. GBR 1885, did not act to avoid contact with GBR 2642 when it was reasonably possible. GBR 1885 broke RRS 14.
- 3. It was not reasonably possible for GBR 2642, the right-of-way boat, to avoid contact with GBR 1885 when it was clear that GBR 1885 was not keeping clear. GBR 2642 did not break RRS 14.
- 4. By taking the one-turn penalty, GBR 1885 took an appropriate penalty according to RRS 44.1

DECISION

Protest upheld. No further penalty applied.
