NOTICE OF RACE









The Organizing Authority (OA) is Yacht club Marina Portorož in cooperation with the International Melges 24 Class Association (IM24CA) and the Slovenian Melges 24 Class Association.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The NoR of the Melges24 European Sailing series will apply.
- 1.3 The Equipment Rules of Sailing will apply.
- 1.4 The Class Rules of the IM24CA will apply.
- 1.5 RRS Appendix P will apply as changed in NOR 12.4.
- 1.6 The following rules will be changed in accordance with RRS 86.1(b):
- 1.6.1 RRS 40.1 applies and will be changed as follows; All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices all the time while racing, except for brief periods while changing or adjusting clothing. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices. This also changes preamble of part 4.
- 1.6.2 The Race Committee (RC) will use VHF radio to communicate to the fleet. Failure in broadcasting or failure to hear the broadcast shall not constitute grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1. The sailing instructions will provide more details about the procedure.
 - 1.6.3 The Sailing Instructions may also change other racing rules.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.
- 2.2 The Sailing Instructions will also be posted on the online official notice board.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at www.racingrulesofsailing.org/documents/6000/event
- 3.2 All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.
- 3.4 From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the Melges 24 class that meet the obligations of the Class Rules and when relevant, their Member National Authority.
- 4.2 Competitors shall comply with the World Sailing Eligibility Code which requires that all competitors (helmspersons and all other crew) shall be members of their Member National Authority or one of its affiliated organizations. The Yacht Club or organization name and membership details shall be stated when entering.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by sending an email to <u>branko@skipper.si</u> whit boat name and sail number together with the required fee by April 19th, 2023.

Note: completed entry includes payment of entry fee.

5 CATEGORIZATION

- 5.1 The World Sailing Sailor Categorization Code will apply to teams in the Corinthian Division (see RRS
- 79). Please refer to World Sailing Web site: www.sailing.org
- 5.2 Indicate categorization and the unique World Sailing sailor ID for each sailor at registration if entering for the Corinthian Division.
- 5.3 Categorization will be checked at registration. A final list will be published at the close of registration.
- 5.4 The Categorization Protest Time Limit is the end of the protest time limit on the first day of racing.
- 5.5 Full details for the Corinthian Trophy can be found in IM24CA Championship Rules.







5.6 Should a boat whose Corinthian entry has been checked and accepted need to change a crew member between the closing date of entries and the start of the regatta, the name of the new crew member with their valid World Sailing sailor ID and group number shall be submitted to the OA.

6 FEES

- 6.1 Entry Fee includes launching at commencement and recovery at conclusion of the Event at designated times, berthing for the event, trailer storage, entries to the social events (if any) for all competing crews during event dates.
- 6.2 Payment until April 21st, 2023 will be € 350,00 (entry fee)
- 6.3 Payment options:

6.4 Entries will not be valid until the payment will be received and confirmed by the Event office. The date of the competitor's bank transfer will be considered.

7 ADVERTISING

- 7.1 Advertising will be conform to World Sailing Regulation 20 and the Class Rules, in accordance with RRS 6.
- 7.2 Boats may be required to display identification numbers and sponsors' advertising for the duration of the event, chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority at the completion of entry procedure at the venue. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies.

8 SCHEDULE

- 8.2 Nine (9) races are scheduled.
- 8.3 The RC may race as many as three (3) races each day.
- 8.4 If in the opinion of Race Committeethe event is behind schedule or likely to fall behind schedule, four (4) races may be raced on one day.
- 8.5 The O.A. and/or the R.C. reserve the right to modify the program due to weather conditions or other reasons. The proper communication will be posted on the Official Notice Board by 20:00 hours on the day before it will take effect.
- 8.6 On the last day there will be no warning signal after 15:00.

9 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 9.1 Each boat shall produce a valid Measurement Certificate before the close of registration.
- 9.2 The Technical Committee may weigh, measure or inspect any boat and or her equipment and sails before or after the races.







- 9.3 In accordance with RRS G3, a boat chartered or loaned for this event may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of the Class Rules.
- 9.4 During the event checks on conformity with Class Rules, including measurement requirements may be performed at any time.
- 9.5 Crew weight must be checked before 10:00 on April 21st, 2023.

10 VENUE

Appendix B shows the location of Marina Portorož and the racing areas.

11 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be windward-leeward. Offset mark and leeward gate will be used.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 12.1 The first two sentences of RRS 44.1 are changed to read: "A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 or RRS 31 or Class Rule C.11 while racing.
- 12.2 Unless the course is shortened to finish at the windward mark, penalties while in the zone of the windward mark or on the offset leg may be delayed and taken as soon as possible on the downwind leg. This changes RRS 44.2.
- 12.3 If a member of the Jury witnesses a breach of RRS Part 2, RRS 31 and/or Class Rule C.11, they may indicate their observation by making a long sound (whistle) and a red flag. The boat shall then exonerate itself by complying with NOR 12.1. If no penalty is taken the Jury may protest.
- 12.4 Appendix P (Special Procedures for Rule 42) will apply. RRS P2.3 will not apply and RRS P2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one. The penalty under RRS P2.1 is changed to be a one-turn penalty. This changes RRS Appendix P.

13 SCORING

- 13.1 Two (2) races are required to be completed to constitute the series.
- 13.2 (a) When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When from five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 14.1 Coach and support person vessels shall register with the OA within the registration time limit. Only support vessels that have registered with the OA.
- 14.2 The IM24CA coach and support person vessel Appendix shall be in operation and it is attached to this NOR as appendix A.
- 14.3 Each person on board a coach or support person boat shall be deemed a *support person* as per RRS Definitions and subject to RRS 64.5.

15 LAUNCHING AND BERTHING

- 15.1 Cranage times will be detailed on the Official Notice Board.
- 15.2 All boats shall be afloat by 10:30 hours on April 21th, 2023.
- 15.3 Except when sailing, all boats shall be kept in their assigned docks at Marina Portorož. Fenders and mooring lines will be required.
- 15.4 Bow numbers may establish the priority or order of berthing assignments, haul out order, and other items at the discretion of the OA.

16 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Boats shall not be hauled out during the event except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the Race Committee.

17 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Underwater breathing apparatus (excluding snorkels) and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around boats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.







18 RISK STATEMENT

18.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

18.2 Competitors participate in the event entirely at their own risk. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

19 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 1.500.000 € per event or the equivalent.

20 PRIZES

List of prizes to be awarded:

- first three boats overall,
- first three boats in Corinthian category

21 TELEVISION & PHOTOGRAPHERS' RIGHTS

21.1 Competitors give absolute right and permission for video footage or photographs of themselves or their boat to be published in any media for press, editorial or advertising purposes. Media rights waivers shall be signed by all competitors during registration/check-in.

21.2 Competitors may be required to carry a tracking device system on board while racing.

APPENDIX A

COACH, SUPPORT, PRESS & SPECTATOR VESSELS

COACH AND SUPPORT VESSELS

- 1. Coach and support vessels shall register with the race office during registration. They shall declare which boat or boats they are attached to.
- 2. Coach and support vessels shall display a flag, or other identification symbol, as may be required by the race committee.
- 3. No coach vessels or support vessels shall pass information in any way to a boat that is racing. Rule 41 infringements of this will be taken very seriously.
- 4. Coach and support vessels shall communicate only with the boats they are registered to, and only by means of voice between races. Closed VHF or mobile telephone communication is prohibited.
- 5. All Melges 24 boats shall proceed to and from the racing area under their own power.
- 6. There shall be no transfer of any goods or equipment until after the finish of the last race of the day between Melges 24's and their coach or support vessels.
- 7. Coach and support vessels shall not go alongside their Melges 24's until after the finish of the last race of the day.
- 8. Coach and support vessels shall keep clear of the racing area at all times during racing.
- 9. Any coach or support vessels that interferes with another competitor or the racing in any way, including creating excess wash, or hinders an official vessels carrying out its duties shall have the competitor(s) to which they are attached, liable to a penalty at the discretion of the jury.
- 10. Any competitor may protest under this attachment.
- 11. The penalty given by the jury is at their discretion, but shall be applied to the overall score and therefore not discarded.

PRESS AND SPECTATOR VESSELS

- 1. All Press and official spectator vessels shall be registered by the race organizing authority during registration.
- 2. Press and spectator vessels shall display any flag, or other identification symbol as may be required by the race committee.
- 3. The race organizers may appoint one or more photo vessels, which will be allowed within the race course. The position of these vessels shall not be grounds for redress.
- 4. Press and spectator vessels shall not interfere with the racing in anyway and shall stay at a distance outside the racecourse where their wake causes no problem.
