# Amendment #2 Change to 7.0 SCHEDULE

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

- 1 RULES
- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 [DP] RRS 40.1 applies and is amended so that it applies at all times while afloat.
- 1.3 The following national prescription may require advance preparation:

RRS 46 – Person in Charge – Sail Canada prescribes that the designated person in charge, if resident in Canada, shall be a member of Sail Canada through either a club affiliated to Sail Canada or such person's Provincial Sailing Association.

1.4 RRS Appendix T "Arbitration" will apply.

- 1.6 A boat that sails with a sail number she is not registered with or received permission from the race committee to sail with will receive a 10% scoring penalty (RRS44,3), This changes RRS 66.1 and RRS A5.

#### 2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be posted on the online official notice board.
- 3 COMMUNICATION
- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at:

- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY
- 4.1 For boats to be accepted for this event, the online registration form must be completed and all fees must be received by 1800 August 16, 2023. No entries will be accepted after this time.
- 4.2 The regatta is open to boats of the International 14 Class.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online form and submitting it through the event website www.cork.org.
- 4.4 All sailors and support personnel 18 years of age or older must sign the waiver and release of liability form (Appendix 1)
- 4.5 To complete the entry process, participants must pay all fees and complete the attached checklist (Appendix 2) inclusive of the measurement checks listed on the checklist.

- 5.1 The entry fee covers racing and site use from August 17 20, 2023.
- 5.2 In the case of event cancellation or postponement by CORK, all fees except for bank charges will be refunded
- 5.3 All fees except for bank charges will be refunded to boats that cancel prior to August 3, 2023.
- 6 [DP] ADVERTISING

6.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies.

- 7.1 The race committee may run one extra race on a day provided that they do not get more than one race ahead of the daily schedule and do not exceed the number of races scheduled for the event.
- 7.2 The race committee may replace two consecutive fleet races with a distance race on any day or time except for the first day. The distance race will be posted by 2000 hrs on the day before it will take effect The distance race will be described on the Official Notice Board.

# **8 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION**

- 8.1 Each boat shall produce their sails, foils and measurement certificate to the class measurer during registration.
- 8.2 [DP] Boats shall be available for equipment inspection from the time of registration at the club.
- 8.3 Boats may be inspected at any time.

#### 9 VENUE

9.1 Sailing will be in Lake Ontario South of Portsmouth Olympic Harbour.

#### 10 COURSES

10.1 The courses to be sailed will be Windward/Leeward-triangle courses or distance course.

# 11 [DP] [NP] SUPPORT PERSONNEL AND VESSELS

- 11.1 Support persons shall register online and if their entry is approved, present a form (Appendix 4) containing the boats they are supporting to the onsite check in point.
- 11.2 All support personnel shall comply with CORK's Support Team Regulations <a href="https://cork.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/06/CORK-Support-Team-Regulations-V3-2023-06-07.pdf">https://cork.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/06/CORK-Support-Team-Regulations-V3-2023-06-07.pdf</a>
- 11.3 Support persons are required to monitor the CORK course channel on their VHF radios and be available to assist with safety when requested. The VHF channel will be stated in the sailing instructions.

11.4 Coaches are expected to attend the coaches meeting each morning. The sailing instructions may give additional requirements for support persons on the water.

# 12 [DP] BERTHING

12.1 Boats shall be kept in their assigned places/area while they are in the boat park.

# 13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY AND RISK STATEMENT

RRS 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission.
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizers does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

# 14 INSURANCE

14.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a boat has valid third-party liability insurance.

#### 15 PRIZES

- 15.1 Awards will be provided by the fleet for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishing boats.
- 15.2 The William Randolph Hearst Trophy for the International 14 North American Champion will be awarded to the winning team.
- 15.3 In the event that a distance race is held, the winner will be awarded the Gorgeo Bastardo Trophy.
- 15.4 Other awards may be given.

Support personnel or support person means any person registered in that capacity with the Organization for the Event, including team leaders, coaches, parents, and other such persons who are acting in support of a sailor.

In consideration of my participation in the event described above (the "Event") hosted by CORK/Sail Kingston Inc. (the "Organization"), I (and my heirs and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns), agree to the following (the "Agreement"):

- 1. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I agree to abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of the Organization (and of any class or sailing association whose rules govern the Event), including all COVID-19 related safety measures required by the Organization.
- 2. CERTAIN REPRESENTATIONS: My boat is in good order, equipped to participate in the Event and I am fit to participate; the provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the Event organizers does not relieve me of my own responsibilities; the provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- 3. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of sailing and attendance at an Event, and that participation in any Event

involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), hypothermia (cold water and air), concussion, sickness, trauma, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants or natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

- 4. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the Event, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties (defined below), and I voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in the Event. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me or any agents under my direction and control at any Event.
- 5. RELEASE I release from liability and waive any claims against the Organization, together with its officers, directors, employees, volunteers and agents (the "Released Parties"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the Event, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties, whether passive or active.
- 6. - 8. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.
- 9. APPLICABLE LAW AND JURISDICTION: This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of Ontario (and the laws of Canada applicable therein).
