PROCEDURAL MATTERS

- 1. Hearing was scheduled and posted on the notice board for 14:45 and commenced at 14:51.
- 2. Text messages and emails were sent to the parties to notificy them to the scheduled hearing.
- 3. No representatives of 135 were in attendance at the beginning of the hearing, and the hearing commenced in accordance with RRS 63.3(b).
- 4. Bruce Stone represented Arbitrage
- 5. Eric Raff represented J Tripper
- 6. The hearing was heard with a panel of three members in accordance with RRS N1.4(b).

FACTS FOUND

- 1. 5 seconds before the start of Race 7 in the J105 fleet
- 2. 15-20 knots of wind with moderate chop.
- 3. 116 approaching the start on starboard 3-5 boatlengths to leeward of the RC signal boat.
- 4. 135 was approximately 1 boatlength to leeward, slightly ahead of 116 and moving more slowly
- 5. 135 luffed head to wind
- 6. 135 passed head to wind as their jib backwinded.
- 7. When it became clear that 135 was not keeping clear, 116 luffed
- 8. The bow of 135 collided with 116 on the port side near midships
- 9. Damage to 116 included a hole in the gelcoat where the deck meets the hull and damage to the plastic toe rail.
- 10. 116 completed Race 7, finishing 4th.
- 11. No injuries resulted from the collision
- 12. 135 promptly completed a turn including a tack and a gybe.

CONCLUSIONS AND RULES THAT APPLY

Rules: 10, 14

- 1. 135 on port failed to keep clear of 116 on starboard, and broke RRS 10
- 2. 135 did not avoid contact with 116 when it was reasonably possible. 135 broke RRS 14.
- It was not reasonably possible for 116, the right-of-way boat to avoid contact with 135 when it was clear that 135 was not keeping clear. 116 did not break RRS 14.
- 4. The damage is not considered serious under RRS 44.1 therefore the appropriate penalty was taken.
