Competition Area Regulations (CAR)

[DP] Competition Area Regulations (CAR)

1. General Requirements

- 1.1 These Competition Area Regulations (CAR) shall apply from 19 27 September 2023.
- 1.2 They apply to all accredited personnel, including athletes, support persons, race officials, Field Cast and media and broadcast representatives.
- 1.3 The 19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022 Sailing Instructions (SIs) and supporting documents on penalties clarify CAR obligations where penalties will be applied. These are referenced by [DP] (Discretionary Penalty) or [SP] (Standard Penalty) in this document.
- 1.4 (See Sailing Instruction 7) All boats and vessels shall remain within the Field of Play whilst on the water during the period from 19 27 September 2023. No part of any boat or vessel shall:
 - 1.4.1 cross the boundary of the Field of Play; or
 - 1.4.2 enter a prohibited area within the Field of Play; or
 - 1.4.3 enter or remain on the Field of Play when it is closed.
- 1.5 AG Technical Delegates may grant dispensations in writing from one or more of these Competition Area Regulations in exceptional circumstances. Any request for a dispensation must be made in writing and any dispensation granted will be published.

2. Field of Play definition

The approximate race areas, within the Field of Play, are shown in Addendum A.

3. Field of Play restrictions

- 3.1 The Field of Play will not be monitored until 18 September 2023. Publicity material to the local community requests non- accredited traffic keep out of the Field of Play during 19 27 September 2023.
- 3.2 No training partners or other non-accredited vessels of teams are permitted in the Field of Play while the Competition Area Regulations apply.
- 3.3 During 19 27 September 2023, if any part of a boat or vessel crosses the Field of Play boundary, it will be deemed to have left the exclusion zone and the boat or vessel and anyone on board may be subject to security quarantine and search before being permitted back into the Venue.
- 3.4 Check out and check in and identification
 - 3.4.1 All accredited athletes going afloat shall check out and check in as described in the sailing instructions except that tracking devices will not be provided for those boats not scheduled for racing on that day.
 - 3.4.2 All accredited support vessels shall display their National Olympic Committee (NOC) code and allocated number as set out in the Support Team Regulations (STR).
 - 3.4.3 All accredited support vessels going afloat shall check out and check in as described in the Support Team Regulations (STR).
- 3.5 The Field of Play is closed whenever the Venue is closed.
- 3.6 The Field of Play will close at 1700 for boats and their support vessels not scheduled to race on that day.
- 3.7 For those boats scheduled to race the Field of Play will close as soon as practicable after the last race finishes or AP/A or N/A is displayed.
- 3.8 [DP] The Field of Play will open for boats scheduled to race that day when flag D over their event flag is displayed ashore. For all other boats, the Field of Play will open two (2) hours after flag D is displayed
- 3.9 For the period 19 27 September 2023 from 1100 to 1700 the perimeter of the Field of Play will be patrolled by security vessels

4. Medical Evacuation sites

4.1 Medical evacuation sites will be displayed on the Official Notice Board on or before 18 September 2023.

5. Security awareness

- 5.1 All vessels have a security responsibility. Should anything suspicious be observed, particularly an incursion into the Field of Play by a non-accredited vessel or person, immediately notify the Security vessel or through a nearby race management vessel.
- 5.2 The report should cover where possible:
 - a brief description of the potential threat;
 - the location where it has been observed;
 - if the object is moving, the direction and speed of travel; and
 - any other material information.
