2 RULES

- 2.1 The 2019 ANOC World Beach Games will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2017-2020. Other documents under RRS Definition: Rule (g) include:
- 2.1.1 The Qualification System (QS) for the 2019 ANOC World Beach Games Sailing Competition
- 2.1.2 [DP] [SP] The Equipment Regulations (ER); and
- 2.1.3 [NP] [DP] The Competitors Media Guide (CMG)
- 2.2 RRS Appendix F applies.
- 2.3 Local Sailing Instructions (LSI) will be published and may change or supplement rules in these NoR/SIs.
- 2.4 No national prescriptions will apply.
- 2.5 A kiteboard shall neither make radio transmissions while competing nor receive radio communications not available to all kiteboards, except in an emergency or when using equipment provided by the organizing authority. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 2.6 In all rules governing the event;
- 2.6.1 The terms 'rider', 'competitor', 'crew', 'athlete' and 'owner' mean a person competing or intending to compete in the event;
- 2.6.2 The term 'support person' means persons as defined by the Racing Rules of Sailing;
- 2.6.3 [DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the Protest Committee.





- 2.6.4 [SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the Race Committee or Technical Committee without a hearing or a discretionary penalty applied by the Protest Committee with a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.
- 2.6.5 [NP] denotes a rule that shall not be grounds for protests by a kiteboard. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 2.7 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 2.8 Changed Rules:
- 2.8.1 Add rule 62.1(e): the action of a drone, or any other flying device, significantly affecting the safety or the fairness of the competition for a kiteboard.
- 2.8.2 In rule F.44.2 replace 'hull' with 'hull appendage'.
- 2.8.3 For RAM-Air (foil-) kites, class rule C.3.2(a) does not apply.
- 2.8.4 Class Rule C.4.2(a) does not apply.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Only competitors from Member National Authorities (MNA) affiliated with National Olympic Committees (NOC) recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) may enter the regatta
- 3.2 Each athlete shall be a national of the country of the NOC that is entering him or her. An athlete's nationality shall be determined according to Rule 41 and the By-law to Rule 41 of the Olympic Charter.
- 3.3 Olympic gender requirements will apply.
- 3.4 World Sailing Eligibility will apply.
- 3.5 Competitors under 18 years of age shall present a signed and completed parent or guardian consent and declaration form at each on-site registration (see attachments)
- 3.6 [NP] [SP] [DP] Athletes, coaches and team leaders shall complete the on-site entry confirmation at the Race Office between 0900 1100 hours on October 12, 2019, prior to the start of their equipment inspection.





4 EVENTS AND QUOTAS

There shall be competition in the following events, classes and categories:

5 SCHEDULE

5.1 The schedule will be as follows (all times are local time):

- 5.2 For each event, 8 races are scheduled for the Qualification Series, 2 races are scheduled for each Semi-Final, and a maximum of 6 races are scheduled for the Final Series
- 5.3 Addendum B shows the provisional race schedule, including the time of the first warning signals and the number of scheduled races.
- 5.4 An update to Addendum B will be posted daily no later than 2000 on the previous evening of any race affected.





- 5.5 Races not sailed on the scheduled day may be sailed on the following day at the discretion of the race committee.
- 5.6 Not more than one race per event may be sailed ahead of schedule at the discretion of the race committee.
- 5.7 Not more than a total of 7 races per event will be sailed per day.
- 5.8 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 30 minutes before sunset.

6 FORMAT

- 6.1 The format for each event is an Opening Series followed by Semi-Finals and the Medal Series.
- 6.2 The two best-ranked kiteboards after the Opening Series qualify directly to the Medal Series.
- 6.3 Kiteboards ranked 3-14 in the Opening Series will be assigned to the Semi-Finals as follows:

- 6.3 The winner of each Semi-Final qualifies to the Medal Series
- 6.4 The Medal Series will continue until one kiteboard collects three wins.
- 6.5 Addendum D shows a visual description of the format.

7 STARTING AND FINISHING

7.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee vessel and the course side of the nearby inflatable starting mark.





- 7.2 A buoy may be attached to the Race Committee starting vessel anchor line just below keel depth. Kiteboards shall not pass between this buoy and the Race Committee starting vessel at any time. This buoy is part of the race committee starting vessel's ground tackle.
- 7.3 To alert kiteboards that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.
- 7.4 The table in RRS 26 is deleted and replaced with the following:

- 7.5 [DP] When a starting sequence is in progress, kiteboards whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. The starting area is defined as an area 100 meters from the starting line and marks in all directions.
- 7.6 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the finish race committee vessel and the course side of the nearby finish mark.
- 7.7 [DP] Kiteboards that have finished racing shall sail clear of the finish area.

8 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

8.1 Time limits and target times, in minutes, are as follows:

8.2 If no kiteboard rounds Mark 1 within the Mark 1 time limit, the race will be abandoned. Failure to meet the target time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).





8.3 Any kiteboard failing to finish within the Finish Time Window (time after the first kiteboard starts, sails the course as required by RRS 28 and finishes) shall be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

9 COURSES AND RACING AREAS

- 9.1 The diagrams in Addendum A show the courses, the course designations, the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 9.2 Courses will not be shortened. This changes RRS 32.
- 9.3 Addendum C shows the location of the venue and the course area.
- 9.4 Access to the sailing venue will be restricted to accredited athletes and support personnel.

10 [DP] [NP] IDENTIFICATION AND ADVERTISING

- 10.1 Clothing and equipment worn or used by athletes and support personnel shall be in compliance with rule 50 and the bye-laws to rule 50 of the Olympic Charter.
- 10.2 Except as permitted by this rule, a kiteboard shall not display any form of publicity or propaganda, commercial or otherwise, including the display of a boat name, home port or club name.
- 10.3 When provided by the local organizing authority, kiteboards and competitors shall carry, display or wear the following as instructed:
- 10.3.1 "Look of the Games" logos, national country codes and/or flags on hulls and helmets
- 10.3.2 Competition bibs for all competitors with an individually assigned competition number, worn as intended over all other clothing and equipment at any time when afloat
- 10.3.3 Individual event leader bibs with an individually assigned competition number, worn as intended over all other clothing and equipment at any time when afloat





- 10.3.4 Cameras and other media equipment
- 10.3.5 [SP] Tracking and timing equipment.

11 COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 11.1 The official notice board is online here:
 - https://www.racingrulesofsailing.org/documents/event?event_id=687&name=2019-anoc-world-beach-games-qatar
 - Complementary information will be posted on a notice board in the venue.
- 11.2 The location of the complementary notice board and the official flagpole will be described in the LSL.
- 11.3 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 20 minutes' in the race signal AP. This changes Race Signals.
- 11.4 When a visual signal is displayed over an area or event flag, the signal applies only to that area or event. This changes the Race Signals preamble.
- 11.5 The LSIs will be posted on the official notice board no later than the technical meeting.

12 CHANGES TO NOTICE OF RACE AND SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the NoR/SI and the LSI will be posted 30 minutes before it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted not later than the end of the protest time limit of the last event on the day before it will take effect.





13 [NP] [DP] SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 13.1 Flag G displayed ashore means 'Kiteboards shall not leave the beach. Wait for further instructions.'
- 13.2 Flag G displayed afloat means 'Kiteboards shall return to the beach as soon as reasonably possible.'

14 [DP] CODE OF CONDUCT

- 14.1 Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official.
- 14.2 Kiteboards not racing shall remain clear of areas where kiteboards are racing and any official boat.

15 SCORING

- 15.1 1 race per event is required to be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 15.2 Opening Series
- 15.2.1 4 races are required to be completed to constitute an Opening Series
- 15.2.2 A kiteboard's Opening Series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her worst score when 4 to 6 races are completed, and her two worst scores when 7 and more races are completed.
- 15.3 Semi-Finals
- 15.3.1 A kiteboard's Semi-Final score will be the total of a score carried forward according to her Opening Series position, plus her Semi-Finals race scores.
- 15.3.2 For each Semi-Final, the carried forward score of a kiteboard is

- 15.4 Medal Series
- 15.4.1 The first-ranked kiteboard in the Opening Series carries forward two race wins to the Medal Series
- 15.4.2 The second-ranked kiteboard in the Opening Series carries forward one race win to the Medal Series
- 15.4.3 The winner of each Semi Final does not carry any race wins to the Medal Series
- 15.4.4 Kiteboards in the Medal Series are ranked in order of the number of race wins, from highest to lowest.
- 15.4.5 If there is a tie in race wins between two or more kiteboards, they will be ranked in the order of their finishing positions in the last race.
- 15.5 For the remaining event overall standings, kiteboards will be ranked according to their scores in the Semi Final as follows:

Kiteboards ranked 2nd in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 5 and 6

Kiteboards ranked 3rd in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 7 and 8

Kiteboards ranked 4th in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 9 and 10

Kiteboards ranked 5th in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 11 and 12

Kiteboards ranked 6th in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 13 and 14

It there is a tie they will be ranked according to their finishing position in the Qualifying Series.

The remaining kiteboards will be ranked from place 15 and on, according to their finishing position in the Qualifying Series.





- This may not apply to a kiteboard disqualified under RRS 5, 6 or 69.
- 15.6 If the Medal Series cannot be completed, kiteboards will be ranked in the order of their Opening Series results.
- 15.7 The race committee may cancel the Semi Final stage if the completion of the Medal Series is in jeopardy. In this case, kiteboards ranked 3 and 4 after the Qualifying Series advance to the Medal Series and carry forward zero race wins each.
- 15.8 A kiteboard starting later than 1 minute after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
- 15.9 To request correction of an alleged error in the posted race or series results, a kiteboard may complete a scoring enquiry form available at the race office.

16 [NP] EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 16.1 [SP] Kiteboards shall be available for inspection from 12:00 hours on October 12, 2019.
- 16.2 The fact that race officials may conduct inspections of a kiteboard does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this NoR/S and Event Equipment Rules (ER).
- 16.3 All kiteboards are required to comply with RRS 78.1 and Event Equipment Rules (ER) from the time of the first scheduled warning signal.
- 16.4 [DP] Competitors shall complete and deliver a completed Equipment Registration Form before 12:00 hours on October 12, 2019. This may be done electronically through a system provided by the technical committee. Exceptions may be authorized by the technical committee.
- 16.5 [DP] Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the race committee or technical committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee(s) at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 16.6 [SP] When coming ashore, a kiteboard may be instructed by a member of the race committee or the technical committee to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.
- 16.7 [SP] Information on equipment to be inspected on October 12, 2019 will be posted before 1100 hours on October 12, 2019, and after racing each day on the official notice board within the protest time limit. Competitors shall present the equipment to be inspected at the time posted.





16.8 After October 12, 12:00 hours, no kiteboard or inspected equipment shall be removed from the venue or the adjacent waters without written permission of the Organizing Authority

17 INTERNATIONAL JURY

An international jury will be appointed in accordance with the RRS 91(b). Its decisions will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

18 PROTESTS, PENALTIES AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 18.1 Protest forms are available at the race office or jury office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered to the jury office within the appropriate time limit.
- 18.1.1 The protest time limits will be described in the LSI.
- 18.1.2 If rule N1.4(b) applies, the time limit for requesting a hearing under that rule is 30 minutes after the party was informed of the panel's decision.
- 18.2 Notices will be posted within 15 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held beginning at the time posted. Hearings may be scheduled to begin up to 15 minutes before the end of the protest time limit.
- 18.3 Notices of protests by the race committee, technical committee or protest committee may be posted to inform kiteboards under RRS 61.1(b).
- 18.4 A list of kiteboards that have been penalized for causing tangles will be posted.
- 18.5 Penalties for breaches of the ER, STR, CMG, class rules, RRS 55 or rules in the NoR and SIs marked [DP] or [SP], should the case go to a hearing, are at the discretion of the protest committee.
- 18.6 For breaches of NoR/SI marked [SP], the race committee may apply a standard penalty without a hearing to the race closest in time to the incident. The scores of other kiteboards shall not be changed; therefore, two kiteboards may receive the same score. However, the





race committee may protest a kiteboard when they consider the standard penalty to be inappropriate. A kiteboard that has been penalized with a standard penalty can neither be protested for the same incident by another kiteboard nor can another kiteboard request redress for this race committee action. This changes RRS 60.1, 63.1 and Appendix A5.

- 18.7 On the last day of the Qualification Series, the day of the Semi-Finals and Finals, or on the last scheduled day of racing, a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered:
- 18.7.1 within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day; or
- 18.7.2 no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day;

 This changes RRS 66.
- 18.8 On the last day of the Qualification Series, the day of the Semi-Finals and Finals, or on the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress from a protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes RRS 62.2.

19 [DP] [NP] SUPPORT TEAM PERSONNEL

- 19.1 All support team personnel shall register with the local organizing authority at registration day and shall comply with the local legislation. The local organizing authority may refuse registrations or accept later registrations at their discretion.
- 19.2 Support team personnel shall not go afloat.

20[DP] [NP] PRIZES

20.1 Medals and diplomas will be awarded in each event of the competition, as follows:

1st place: A gold medal, and a diploma. 2nd place: A silver medal, and a diploma. 3rd place: A bronze medal, and a diploma.

4th-8th places: A diploma.





20.2 During the medal presentation, accreditation must either be temporarily surrendered to the victory ceremony coordinator or hidden out of sight. No participant in the victory ceremony shall carry flags, mobile phone, camera, headphones, sport equipment or other items on them during the ceremony. Athletes shall be wearing their NOC tracksuits or event bib.

21 [NP] [DP] INSURANCE

- 21.1 Each competitor and 'person in charge' (see RRS 46) shall hold a valid insurance certificate showing proof of third-party liability coverage of at least EUR 500,000 or equivalent per incident.
- 21.2 The Organizing Authority is not responsible for verifying the status or validity of certificates.

22 DOPING CONTROL

- 22.1 During the period of the 2019 ANOC World Beach Games, which starts on 08 October 2019 and ends on 17 October 2019, the IOC Anti-Doping Rules (compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code and the mandatory International Standards) will apply.
- 22.2 2019 ANOC World Beach Games will be authorized to collect samples on behalf of the IOC. The doping control station will be located inside the sports cluster.

23 RISK STATEMENT

- 23.1. In cases of force majeure or on grounds of administrative orders or for safety reasons, the organizing authority is entitled to make changes in the realization of the event or to cancel the event. This does not constitute any liability by the organizer towards the participant, if the reasons for the changes or the cancellation do not result from a willful or grossly negligent behavior of the organizer.
- 23.2 In case of a violation of obligations that do not constitute primary or material contractual duties (cardinal obligations), the liability of the organizer for financial and property damages incurred by the participant during or in connection with the participation in the event and resulting from a conduct of the organizer, QATAR 2019, the involved classes and their





representatives, servants or agents (including but not limited to race committee , protest committee and technical committee), is restricted to damages that were caused willfully or grossly negligent. When a violation of cardinal obligations occurs due to minor negligence, the liability of the organizer is limited to foreseeable, typical damages.

- 23.3 Competitors and support team participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk and they are reminded of the provisions of RRS 4, Decision to Race. Kiteboarding is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - They acknowledge that there are risks involved in the Event. They fully realise the dangers of participating in the Event, and fully assume the risks associated with their participation and their wellbeing and safety during and after the Event.
 - They understand and acknowledge that the Event organisers (including all officials and event volunteers) provide no warranties, regarding their wellbeing and safety.
 - They acknowledge that participating in this event may involve a test of a person's physical and mental limits and carries with it the potential for death, serious injury, and property loss. The risks include, but are not limited to, those caused by the elements, facilities, temperature, weather, condition of participants, equipment, vehicular traffic, lack of hydration, and actions of other people including, but not limited to, participants, volunteers, officials, and/or producers of the event.
 - They agree that to the extent permissible by law, World Sailing, the International Kiteboarding Association, their classes, the event organisers (including all officials and event volunteers), ANOC, the sponsors and other parties associated with the Event, have no liability to them whatsoever for any direct or indirect loss, (including, but not limited to injury or death) sustained by them during or in any way related to their participation in the Event.
 - They WAIVE, RELEASE, AND DISCHARGE from any and all liability, including but not limited to, liability arising from the negligence or fault of the entities or persons released, for their death, disability, personal injury, property damage, property theft, or actions of any kind which may hereafter occur to them including their traveling to and from this event, THE FOLLOWING ENTITIES OR PERSONS: World Sailing, The International Kiteboarding Association, their classes, the event organisers (including all officials and event volunteers), ANOC, the sponsors and other parties associated with the Event, employees, volunteers, representatives, and agents, and the event holders, sponsors, and volunteers;
 - They INDEMNIFY, HOLD HARMLESS, AND PROMISE NOT TO SUE the entities or persons
 mentioned in the above paragraphs from any and all liabilities or claims made as a result
 of participation in this event, whether caused by the negligence of release or otherwise.
 - They have taken medical advice on any pre-existing medical conditions and confirm that it is medically safe for them to participate in the Event.
 - They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their equipment and their other property at any time.
 - They are satisfied that their equipment is in good order, equipped to compete in the event and they are fit to participate;





- They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- They consent to receive medical treatment which may be deemed advisable in the event of injury, accident, and/or illness during this event.
- They acknowledge that the provision of a race management and rescue team, judges, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- They acknowledge that the provision of rescue craft cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

24[DP] [NP] MEDIA RIGHTS

- 24.1 By participating in the event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority, ANOC, all involved classes, and their sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during and after the period of the competition without compensation.
- A mixed zone has been planned in the sports cluster and will operate for all competitions for athletes to pass through and give interviews to the media as they leave the field of play.

 Press Operations, in conjunction with Sport, run the press side of the mixed zone. All athletes (and for team sports only, the coaches) are invited to pass through the mixed zone.
- 24.3 The Competitors Media Guide (CMG) will specify further requirements.

25 DATA PROTECTION CLAUSE

With registration the competitor or support person agrees on data usage as defined in this data protection clause.

Reference is made to data protection of personal information and data. Any personal information and data given to the organizers will be used only as follows:

- (a) All data regarding participating athletes, coaches and their kiteboard will be processed and archived for the purpose of this event and events of similar nature that might be of interest to the participant.
- (b) Personal information contains the participant's real name, date of birth, home club, boat type. boat number, address data, mobile phone, email address and emergency contact information.





In particular, results, calculatory and visual analyses, position monitoring and race analyses will be published with reference to the competitors' names.

26.2 Sport Information Desks (SID)

Sport Information Desks will be located at the Athletes Entrance of the competition Venue and the Athletes Village lobby. Information is shared across all desks to ensure that each location has the most up-to-date data.

The Sports Information Desk will provide the Team Leaders all information and services needed to organize and plan their team training and competition. Sport Information Desks will be operational as per below table:

26.5 Athlete's Lounge

A shaded area will be provided for the athlete's rest and preparation located near the





launching area. Refreshments (water, fruit, power bars, coffee and tea) will be available along with ice. Free to access WIFI is available at all the venue areas.

Athletes' change rooms are provided on the venue including showers, toilets and changing areas, separate for men and women.

26.6 Medical Services and Facilities

Medical coverage will be provided by qualified personnel in all the venues & facilities used for the event.

26.7 Venue Access














B 1: Start - Pp - 1p - 2p - 3s - Finish




