

NOTICE OF RACE

STAGE 1: DEC 5TH - 8TH, 2019 STAGE 2: JAN 30TH - FEB 2ND, 2020 STAGE 3: FEB 27TH - MAR 1ST, 2020

1. ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Cyprus International Sailing Club (CISC).

2. RULES

- 2.1 This Regatta shall be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2017–2020.
- 2.2 In case of conflict between the FAREAST 28R Class Rules, the Notice of Race, the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions shall prevail. In case of conflict between the FAREAST 28R Class Rules and the Notice of Race, the Notice of Race shall prevail. If there is a conflict between Notice of Race and Sailing Instruction the sailing instructions takes precedence. This changes RRS 63.7
- 2.3 All competitors are required to wear a life jacket or other adequate personal floatation device while racing. RRS 40 is changed as follows: The "Y" flag will not be displayed.
- 2.4 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 2.5 No national authority prescriptions will apply.
- 2.6 The official language for the event will be English.
- 2.7 Maximum crew number is seven, no weight limit.

3. ADVERTISING

3.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The Regatta is open only to boats of FAREAST 28R Class berthed in Limassol Marina.
- 4.2 Entries shall be made by completing the attached entry form (Attachment 1) and sending it to the Cyprus International Sailing Club's email: hello@cisc.com.cy together with the required entry fees within deadline as per below table:

- 4.3 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 4.4 The Entry may be submitted by the skipper/ team leader without Crew List. Crew list shall be submitted to the Organizing Authority on the first day of respective Stage, the latest.
- 4.5 Entry fee for Stage 2 should be paid until 20.12.2019 and until 20.01.2020 for the Stage 3 otherwise the Organising Authority reserve the right to increase the entry fee up to €1000 per boat after these dates.
- 4.6 Crew lists may be amended by teams up to 9.00 hrs a.m. on the first racing day of the respective Stage by filling a new form showing the changes. After this time, changes in the crew list may only be made with written permission of the Race Committee.

5. ENTRY FEE, DAMAGE DEPOSIT

- 5.1 The entry fee is €870 per boat, per one stage. The entry fee for 3 (three) stages is €2479 per boat, per three stages.
- 5.2 Entry fee for Stage 2 should be paid until **20.12.2019 and until 20.01.2020 for the Stage 3** otherwise the Organising Authority will increase the entry fee up to €1000 per boat for Stage 2 and Stage 3 after these dates.
- 5.3 Entries will not be valid until payment is received and confirmed by the OA.

5.5 Damage deposit of €500 is to be paid during registration for each stage **in cash** and is returned if no damage, otherwise the full amount to cover the damage will be deducted from the deposit.

6. CLASSES AND FLEETS

- 6.1 There will be only one class of boats.
- 6.2 If the number of entries makes one fleet impractical, Race Committee may decide to divide competitors into two fleets.

6.3 The method of division.

On the Day 1 (Thursday) teams will be randomly split into Yellow and Blue fleets of approximately equal size and have free practice. On the Day 2 ((Friday) teams shall take part in Qualifying races ("Qualifying Round").

According to the results of the Qualifying Round the top half of Yellow and Blue fleets will make up the Gold Fleet and the Silver Fleet will consist of the remaining Teams.

Such Gold and Silver fleets will do racing on Day 3 (Saturday) and Day 4 (Sunday) (races on Day 3 and Day 4 shall constitute the "Championship Round"). Scores will not carry from Qualifying Round to Championship Round. Decision for fleets distribution will be based on final entry list and results of Qualifying

6.4 The decision for fleet divisions will be made by the Race Committee based on final entry list and results of Qualifying Round and cannot be ground for a request for redress.



- 7.3 Organizers to make best endeavour to hold 4 races in one race day, which depends on the weather, no warning signal is to be made after 16:55 LT.
- 7.4 The Organizing Authority and the Race Committee reserve the right to modify the above program according to weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances.

8. COURSES AND RACING AREA, SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8.1 COURSES & RACING AREA

The courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward, L1, L2 or L3 as advised by VHF radio.

- 8.2 The intended race area will be the Akrotiri Bay
- 8.3 The final Sailing Instructions will be available for each entrant at completion of the registration formalities.
- 8.4 Any amendments to the Sailing Instructions will be handed over to each skipper at the skippers briefing. Any such changes will be posted on the official notice board(s) as further prescribed in Sailing Instruction.

9 SCORING

- 9.1 Two races are enough to constitute a regatta (in case of Gold and Silver fleets 2 races for each of the fleets).
- 9.2 The Low Point Scoring System will apply.
- 9.3 In case of Gold and Silver fleets, scores will not carry from Qualifying Round to Championship Round.

10 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 10.1 All boats leaving / entering Limassol marina shall report
- (A) to marina on Ch 12,
- (B) to Limassol VTS on Ch 09 when crossing the fairway.
- 10.2 While racing, all teams switch to working Ch 72, unless otherwise advised by the Racing Committee. Boats must use the radio to report if they choose to retire from racing and must use the radio to request assistance in an emergency.
- 10.3 The race committee may use the radio to advise competitors on the race information, course type, starting procedure, shortening the course.

11 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk and responsibility. Special Attention is drawn to RRS 4 "Decision to Race".

The Organizing Authority and any other party involved in the organization of the regatta disclaim any and all responsibility whatsoever for loss, damage, injury, inconvenience, any and all liability for material damage or personal injury or death that might occur to persons and materials, both ashore and at sea in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after, or as a consequence of participation in the event.

Each participant accepts these terms BY SIGNING ENTRY FORM AND TAKING PART IN THE EVENT. The attention of competitors is drawn to ISAF Part 1 Fundamental Rule 4: A boat is solely responsible for deciding whether or not to start or to continue racing.

12 PRI7FS

12.1 The monetary rewards.

In case of single fleet, only the winner of each stage will receive the monetary rewards, while should there be division into Gold and Silver fleets – only the winners of Gold and Silver fleet will receive the monetary rewards. In case of single fleet, the winner of the single fleet shall be rewarded with EUR2000 monetary reward, and should there be division into Gold and Silver fleet, the winner of Gold fleet shall be rewarded with EUR2000 monetary reward, while the winner of the Silver fleet shall be rewarded with EUR1000 monetary reward.

- 12.2 The total amount of monetary rewards shall be from EUR 6000 (EUR 2000 per each stage) in case of a single fleet and up to EUR 9000 (EUR 3000 per each stage) in case there is division into Gold and Silver fleets.
- 12.3 Other trophies or medals to the teams finishing first through third in single fleet and/or the Gold and Silver Fleets at each of the stages as well as overall trophy for all stages may be given at the discretion of the Organizing Authority and the Racing Committee.

13 CHANGES TO THE NOTICE OF RACE

13.1 The Organizing Authority may change the Notice of Race; see rule 89.2(a). Any such changes will be posted in the Winter Series event page on the website: http://www.cisc.com.cy/winter or at the virtual page of Notice of Race of the event: http://www.cisc.com.cy/nor

14 SAFETY REGULATIONS

14.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee, as soon as possible providing the following information:

- Bow Number
- Boat Name
- Sail Number
- Time and position at the moment of retirement
- Reason for retirement
- Actual location of the boat

14.2 All competitors are required to wear a life jacket or other adequate personal floatation device while racing. RRS 40 is changed as follows: The "Y" flag will not be displayed.
