# NOTICE OF RACE & SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (NoR/SI)

Stanley, Hong Kong 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2023

Organising Authority: Windsurfing Association of Hong Kong

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[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is applied according to the RRS Introduction - Notation.

[NP] denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for a protest or request for redress by a board. This changes RRS 60.1(a) and 60.1(b).

[SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and RRS Appendix A5.1

#### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. Hong Kong Sailing Federation Prescriptions will apply, it will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 1.3. RRS Appendix B will apply, however RRS B5 61.1(a) and B8.A8 are deleted.
- 1.4. Supplemental Sailing Instructions (SSI) will be published and may change or supplement rules in these NoR/SI.
- 1.5. The Class Rules for the following classes/divisions will apply:
  - 1.5.1. International iQFOiL Class Rules for Men Division and Women Division of iQFOiL Class;
  - 1.5.2. International iQFOiL Youth & Junior Class Rules for Youth Division (plus Youth Boys Division and Youth Girls Division).
  - 1.5.3. International Raceboard Class Rules for all divisions of Raceboard Class.
- 1.6. Add new RRS rule 27.4 as follows:

The race committee may signal that boards shall sail on a specific tack during the 10 seconds before and 10 seconds after the starting signal is made, by displaying a green flag for starboard tack or a red flag for port tack, before or with the warning signal.

1.7. If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

### 2. ADVERTISING

2.1. Boards may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority. World Sailing Regulation 20 'Advertising Code' shall apply.

#### 3. CLASSES AND DIVISIONS

3.1. The participating classes and divisions shall be:

3.2. Competitors shall participate in 1 class only and shall not change after the registration of the event.

- 3.3. Members of National Squad shall not participate in Open Division of iQFOiL Class.
- 3.4. The Race Committee reserves the right to cancel the Class/Division if necessary.

#### 4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. Entries shall meet the requirements of World Sailing Regulation 19 'Eligibility Code'.
- 4.2. Eligible competitors shall enter online (URL: <a href="https://forms.gle/sdrSeQGgScHszfnE9">https://forms.gle/sdrSeQGgScHszfnE9</a> ) and send a crossed cheque (payable to 'Windsurfing Association of Hong Kong') to the office of the Windsurfing Association of Hong Kong by post

- 4.3. The following documents shall be presented upon registration:
  - 4.3.1. Proof of Identity
  - 4.3.2. Proof of Gender
  - 4.3.3. Proof of Age
- 4.3.4. Parental Permission Form (for those under 18 years old)

#### 5. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

5.1. Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board. The Official Notice Board is located at :

5.2. The organizers will set up a WhatsApp group where they intend to communicate complementary information. The link to join the group will be published in SSI.

#### 6. CHANGES TO NOTICE OF RACE & SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

6.1. Any change to the NoR/SI will be posted not less than 60 minutes before the scheduled warning signal of the race in which it takes effect, except that any change to the schedule of the racing will be posted by 2100 on 6 May 2023.

#### 7. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE & AFLOAT

7.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed at the Official Flag Pole.

- 7.2. **[DP][NP]** When flag AP is displayed ashore, competitors shall not go afloat. '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes'. This changes RRS Race Signals AP.
- 7.3. A signal displayed at the finish vessel applies only to the fleet/group/heat that is finishing. This changes RRS Race Signals preamble.

#### 8. ENTRY FEES

8.1. The entry fee is \$100. (Lunch included)

### 9. RACE FORMAT

- 9.1. Classes and divisions may race together depending upon entry numbers.
- 9.2. iQFOiL Class shall race a maximum of 6 races (of which no more than 4 races of Inner/Outer Trapezoid Course, Windward Leeward Course, Trapezoid Course or Reaching Course per day)
- 9.3. For Slalom Race: iQFOiL Junior Boys Division and iQFOiL Minim Boys Division will race together. They will be assigned to group(s) based on the number of entries who have been physically registered at the race office before 09:30 on the day of racing on the basis of up to a maximum 24 competitors per group.
- 9.3.1. Initially boards will be assigned to groups, as nearly as possible, of equal size and ability according to their latest result in the iQFOiL Junior Boys Division in the Hong Kong Windsurfing Circuit, and finally in random or
- 9.3.2. Competitors who register late will be randomly assigned to groups according to the order stated in the 9.3.7.
- 9.3.3. Two group assignment lists will be used to indicate the group number that a board shall race in the respective races of the day. The assignment list to be used for the race number of the day is specified as follows:

The group assignment lists, both List 1 and List 2 will be posted on the Official Notice Board at the same time at least 45 minutes before the warning signals.

- 9.3.4. If the race is valid for the iQFOiL Junior Boys Division but not for the iQFOiL Minim Boys Division because no competitor of the iQFOiL Minim Boys Division could complete within the time limit, the race concerned shall not be abandoned. This changes RRS 35.
- 9.3.5. At the end of the event, if the number of completed race(s) is different within the groups, the scoring shall be based on the same number of completed race(s), the race which could not be counted for the scoring shall be abandoned.

- 9.4. For Slalom Race: iQFOiL Junior Girls and iQFOiL Minim Girls will race together.
- 9.5. A marathon race may be scheduled for iQFOiL Class and it shall be counted as 2 races
- 9.6. 3 races are required to validate the championship for each division.
- 9.7. The event will be postponed if on the first day:
  - Tropical cyclone warning signal number 3; or
  - Black rainstorm warning signal is in force at 07:00.
  - 9.8. Races will not be started if the wind speed is below/above the lower/upper limit:

#### 10. RACE SCHEDULE

10.2. 4 races of Inner/Outer Trapezoid Course, Windward Leeward Course, Trapezoid Course or Reaching Course may be sailed 'back to back'. 6 races of Slalom Course may be sailed 'back to back'. Races may be sailed before and/or after marathon race.

#### 11. EQUIPMENT AND EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 11.1. The following equipment limitations apply to the iQFOiL Junior division, iQFOiL Junior Boys division, iQFOiL Junior Girls division, iQFOiL Minim division, iQFOiL Minim Boys division and iQFOiL Minim Girls division:
  - iQFOiL 85cm Board
  - Any Sail to Maximum size 7.0 m<sup>2</sup>
  - Any Front Wing Maximum 800 cm<sup>2</sup>
  - Any Back Wing Maximum 255 cm<sup>2</sup>
  - Any Fuselage maximum length 115 cm
  - Any Mast/vertical maximum length 95 cm but must be aluminium
- 11.2. The following equipment limitations apply to the iQFOiL Open division:
  - Any board without dagger board case
- 11.3. Competitors from the divisions of lower age group of iQFOiL Class are eligible to take part in the divisions of higher age group of iQFOiL Class, additional exemptions for iQFOiL Class are given as follows:
  - Men Division: All permitted equipment for Youth Boys Division.
  - Women Division: All permitted equipment for Youth Girls Division.
  - Junior Division: All permitted equipment for Minim Boys Division & Minim Girls Division.
  - Junior Boys Division: All permitted equipment for Minim Boys Division.
  - Junior Girls Division: All permitted equipment for Minim Girls Division.
- 11.4. Equipment inspections may be made at any time during the event.
- 11.5. Upon completion of registration and until the end of the event, at all times when ashore except when launching and retrieving, all equipment shall be kept in their assigned places at the event site. Removal of any equipment from the event site requires prior written approval from the race committee. Access to equipment in the storage area during certain hours, including hours of darkness may be restricted.

Unless otherwise directed by the Organizing Authority, boards and equipment shall be launched and retrieved from the designated area at the event site.

- 13.2. Sail identification stickers will be provided by the organizer. It shall be placed back to back on both sides of the sail at the middle of the second panel from the top of the sail.
- 13.3. Sail identification ribbon will be provided by the organizer.

#### 14. RACING AREA

- 14.1. The map with the location of the Racing areas will be published in the SSI.
- 14.2. The racing area is an area extending 75 meters beyond the course, including the starting line, the finishing line and their extensions, in which a board normally sails while racing.
- 14.3. **[DP][NP]** Boards not racing shall avoid the racing area.

#### 15. **COURSES**

- 15.1. The courses to be sailed are shown in NoR & Sis Addendum A. The diagrams will show the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 15.2. The course to be sailed will be displayed by course flag and number flag.

### 16. **MARKS**

16.1. The marks shall be:

### 17. THE START

17.1. All races will be started by using the following signals. This changes RRS Appendix B3 26.1 and 26.2.

- 17.2. Groups (if applicable) will be indicated by a Numeral Pennant flag, i.e. Pennant 1 means Group 1, Pennant 2 means Group 2, etc. and it shall be displayed before or with the warning signal.
- 17.3. The starting line will be between orange flags on the starting marks.
- 17.4. When the inner distance mark is laid, boards starting shall not pass through between the inner distance mark and the race committee signal boat at all times.
- 17.5. Supplementary Rules for Marathon Race:

The "M", "M1", "M2" or "M3"course flag will be displayed with one sound signal for at least 5 minutes before the orange flag is displayed while the orange flag will be displayed with one sound signal for at least 2 minutes before the warning signal is displayed. The "M", "M1", "M2" or "M3" course flag will be removed at the starting signal. During the period of display for the "M", "M1", "M2" or "M3"course flag, competitors of iQFOiL Class shall report to the race committee that his/her wish of participation in the marathon race. Competitors failing to report to the race committee that his/her wish of participation in the marathon race shall be disqualified without a hearing.

- 17.6. A competitor starting later than 3 minutes (or 1 minute for Slalom Course) after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS Appendix A4 and A5.
- 17.7. To alert boards that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed (with one sound) for at least 2 minutes before a warning signal is made.

- 17.8. **[DP]** When a starting sequence is in progress, boards whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. The starting area is an area extending 75 meters from the starting line and marks in all directions.
- 17.9. If flag I has been displayed, and any part of a board's hull is on the course side of the starting line or one of its extensions during the last minute before her starting signal, she shall sail across an extension so that her hull is completely on the prestart side before she starts.
- 17.10. When an individual recall has been signaled and a board does not comply with RRS 29.1 or a board breaks RRS 30.3 or 30.4, the race committee will display her sail number on the race committee signal boat before the first competitor has finished the race. Failure to display the sail numbers(s) will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 17.11. When the group consists of more than 24 competitors, races sailed in different disciplines (course racing, marathon, sprint slalom) are not considered as resailed or restarted of the previously attempted race.
- 17.12. When the fleet consists of 24 and less competitors, races sailed in different disciplines are considered as resailed or restarted of the previously attempted race with the exception for the marathon.

#### 18. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

18.1. To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

#### 19. THE FINISH

19.1. The finishing line will be between the finishing marks.

#### 20. TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

20.1. Time limits and target times are in minutes for divisions and as follows:

The 'Finish Window' determines the number of minutes allowed for competitors to finish after the first competitor finishes. Boards failing to finish within the time stated in 'Finish Window' shall be scored DNF except those who are scored DSQ, BFD, OCS, UFD, RET, RDG or DNE. This changes RRS 35, Appendix A4 and A5

#### 21. **HEARING REQUESTS**

- 21.1. Hearing request forms are available online at the Event website. Protests and request for redress or reopening shall be submitted there within the appropriate time limit.
- 21.2. **[DP][NP]** Boards retiring from races shall complete a retirement declaration form at the race office before the protest time limit.
- 21.3. [**DP][NP]** Boards taking a voluntary penalty shall complete the penalty acknowledgment form at the race office before the protest time limit.
- 21.4. For each division, the protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last board of her division has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 21.5. Hearing schedules by group, to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as a witness, will be posted online as soon as protests are received online.
- 21.6. Notices of protest by the race committee or jury will be posted on the online to inform boards under RRS 61.1(b).
- 21.7. Breaches of RRS 77 and rules in the NoR/SI marked [NP] will not be grounds for a protest by a board. This changes RRS 60.1(a). Penalties for breaches marked [DP] are at the discretion of the protest committee and may be less than disqualification if the protest committee so decides.
- 21.8. On the last day of the event, a request for redress based on protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes RRS 62.2.
- 21.9. On the last day of the event, a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day or no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day. This changes RRS 66.
- 21.10. Protest time limits, hearing schedules and hearing decisions will be posted online.

#### 22. **SCORING**

- 22.1. A race will be scored as follows:
  - 22.1.1.A Course Racing race will be scored as one race in a Series;
  - 22.1.2.A Slalom Race will be scored as one race. When the division is divided into the groups, the boards will be scored as follows:

- 22.1.3. When racing in groups, a board that did not start, did not sail the course, did not finish, retired or was disqualified shall be scored points for the finishing place two more than the number of boards assigned to the largest group. This changes RRS Appendix A5.2
- 22.1.4.A marathon race will be scored as 2 races.
- 22.2. Each board's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her:
  - worst score when from 4 to 6 races have been completed;

This changes RRS Appendix A2.

#### 23. COACHES AND SUPPORT BOATS

23.1. Support boat drivers shall have a valid boat license and third party liability insurance.

### 24. [DP] [NP] TRASH DISPOSAL

24.1. As sailors, we seek to protect and restore our oceans and coastal waters. Boards shall not intentionally put trash in the water. Trash may be placed aboard coach, support and race committee boats. This changes RRS 47.

### 25. [SP] [NP] SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 25.1. Personal buoyancy and helmet are mandatory for every competitor in iQFOiL Class while afloat.
- 25.2. Personal buoyancy is mandatory for every competitor under 17 years old while afloat.

#### 25.3. Advice:

Competitors of iQFOiL Class are advised to bring along with the electronic device during marathon race for direct communication with the race committee in case of emergency.

- 25.4. The safety system applies when flag Y is displayed ashore:
  - When going out to race, each competitor intending to race shall personally check out; and
  - On returning ashore, each competitor shall personally check in before the protest time limit.
- 25.5. Competitors retiring before finishing shall inform the race committee (race committee boats or rescue boats) as soon as possible. If this is not possible, the competitor shall inform the race office.

#### 25.6. Penalties:

- Failure to check out will result in a 1 point penalty without a hearing for the first race sailed on the day.
- Failure to check in will result in a 1 point penalty without a hearing for the last race sailed on the day.
- Application of these penalties shall not result in a board being scored worse than DSQ.
- Only 1 point penalty for infringements of NoR/SI 25.4 will be applied to any one race.
- If no race is completed on the day of the infringement, the penalty will be applied to the most recently completed race in the series or if there were no races previously completed to the next completed race in the series.

#### 26. PRIZES

26.1. There will be no medals and printed certificates to be provided. (Participants can download e certificate from Festival of Sport Website 2 weeks after the event. Your personal data will be passed to the Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China for the issuing of e-certificate.)

#### 27. Radio Communication

27.1. All coach boats and support person shall carry on board and operate whilst on the water a marine VHF radio capable of receiving and transmitting on VHF 72 and listen to the VHF, and respond to and assist the Race Committee when requested.

#### 28. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

28.1. Competitors participate in the event entirely at their own risk, see RRS 3 - Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority or any of their officials or representatives or the sponsors or their officials or representatives will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the event.

#### 29. **INSURANCE**

29.1. Each participating board shall be insured with valid third party insurance.

#### 30. RIGHT TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

30.1. In registering for the event, competitors automatically grant to the Organizing Authority the right in perpetuity to make, use and show from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproduction of them, taken during the period of the event, for the said event as defined in the NoR/SI in which he or she participates without compensation.


