





Notice of Race for UKLA Qualifier Events Venue Stokes Bay

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a)

1. RULES

- 1.1 Each event is governed by the rules as defined by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 All documents including any amendments, pertaining to this event are available through booking pages as listed in Appendix A of this do

- 1.5 RRS Appendix T, Arbitration, will apply.
- 1.6 Appendix P, Special Procedures for RRS 42, will apply.
- 1.7 Boats shall comply with the Class Rules as posted on the <u>ILCA website</u>. [DP]
- 1.8 ILCA class rule 7 (a) is restricted as follows "only one person shall be on board whilst racing. The person shall be named on the entry form" No substitution of helm is permitted.
- Rule 30.4 (Black flag rule) is added to as follows.
 At the sole discretion of the Race committee, they may display the last four numbers of the sail number for brevity provided there is no ambiguity.
- 1.10 Rule 40.1 shall always apply on the water.
- 1.11 In the case of conflict between the Notice of Series and the Sailing Instructions, SIs will take precedence. This changes rule 63.7.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The Event Sailing Instructions will be published on the Event ONB no later than three days after entry closing date.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official noticeboard for each event is located online with links provided in Appendix A of this document.
- 3.2 While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats. [DP]
- 3.3 Competitors should note that it is anticipated that communication for this event will be online. Event WIFI systems may not be accessible, and they must have a device which can connect to the internet via an alternative means

4. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 4.1 The events are open to all boats of the ILCA dinghy class as shown in Appendix A
- 4.2 Entries will only be accepted via the event website, which can be accessed via the <u>UKLA Events Calendar</u> and listed in Appendix A
- 4.3 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.















- 4.4 Competitors shall be members of the UKLA or a member of a National ILCA class Association.
- 4.5 Entries from Russia and Belarus or with those countries nationality letters are rejected in accordance with the World Sailing guidelines
- 4.6 For Youth and Master categories, the competitors age will determine in which category they are eligible.
- 4.7 The closing date for entries is shown in Appendix A. Entries after the closing date will only be accepted at the discretion of the event organising authority and will attract additional fee equal to 50% of the event entry fee. Please contact: <u>events@ilca.uk</u>.
- 4.8 Sailors aged under eighteen on the first day of the event will need to have a Parent/Guardian Declaration form completed and signed by a parent or guardian, to confirm that the parent/guardian understands and accepts that their sailors are entirely responsible throughout the event for themselves and their boats on land and on the water. Declaration must be completed online via the booking website.
- 4.9 If parent/guardians are not available at the venue, they must appoint loco parentis before the start of the event using this online form.
- 4.10 Sailors may change rig up to the closing date for entry. The change will be considered a new entry. There will be an administration fee of £15 for this change. Should the number of entries for a fleet be exceeded then the new/revised entry will join the waiting list. The Organising authority reserves the right to fill the old entry with a sailor from the appropriate waiting list.

5. FEES

- 5.1 ILCA 4, ILCA 6 and ILCA 7 The entry fee for the event will be in Appendix A of this document
- 5.2 Should the event be cancelled, a refund of at least 85% of the entry fee will be made after transfer fees. This will be dependent on the expenditure committed to by the event and at the discretion of the Organising Authority.

5.4 The entry fee may include a bowl of pasta after each day's racing.

6. CREW LIMITATIONS

6.1 Please refer to NOR RULES 1.6

7. ADVERTISING

7.1 Boats may also be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority [DP]

8. QUALIFYING SERIES AND FINAL SERIES

8.1 If class numbers require it, the event may be flighted, at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority details will be in the SIs.

9. SCHEDULE

- 9.1 Registration times for each event are 0830-10.00 and the location given in the SI's.
- 9.2 Equipment Inspection See NOR 10
- 9.3 Number of Races Classes will sail up to 6 races in an Event, with 3 races scheduled per day, but a maximum of 4 races per day.
- 9.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race of each event is 11:55 for all classes, unless changed in the Event Sailing Instructions















- 9.5 On the last schedule day of racing at an Event, no warning signal will be made after 15:00
- 9.6 Each day succeeding races will be started as soon as practicable after the finish of the previous race.

10. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 10.1 Boats may be inspected at any time
- 10.2 Sail/sail number changes following entry closing may only be requested using the equipment substitution process detailed in the SIs
- 10.3 Boats shall also comply with RRS 78.1 [DP]

11. CLOTHING & EQUIPMENT

- 11.1 Wet clothing may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules as permitted by RRS 50.1(b)
- 11.2 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the race committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity. [DP]

12. VENUE

12.1 The SIs will show the course area.

13. COURSES

13.1 The courses to be sailed will be Inner or outer loop trapezoid with a 45-minute target time for each race. Unless specified differently in the SIs

14. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 14.1 Appendix P, Special Procedures for RRS 42, will apply. The Event Sailing Instructions will state Rule P2.3 will not apply and rule P2.2 is changed so that it will apply to any penalty after the first one at each Individual event.
- 14.2 Jury members may blow a whistle when they see what they believe to be a breach of a rule.

15. SCORING

- 15.1 Two races shall be completed to constitute a series.
- 15.2 The total score for each boat at each event will be the sum of her scores as follows:

15.2.1 When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

15.2.2 When from four or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

16. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

16.1 Support Boat and Support Person Rules are set out in SIs and may vary from event to event.

17. CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

18. BERTHING AND LAUNCHING

- 18.1 Boats shall be kept in their assigned area of the dinghy park during the events from the start of their event until the completion of the final race. [DP]
- 18.2 Tallying shall be required. Tally Instructions will be given in the SIs. [DP]

21. DATA PROTECTION

21.1 The personal information you provide to the Organising Authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the event. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the Organising Authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, Racingrulesofsailing.org, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

22. RISK STATEMENT

- 22.1 Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - 22.1.1 They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
 - 22.1.2 They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat, and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
 - 22.1.3 They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.
 - 22.1.4 Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
 - 22.1.5 The provision of a race management team, patrol boats if any and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
 - 22.1.6 The provision of patrol boat cover if any is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can practically be provided in the circumstances.
 - 22.1.7 It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules or information produced for the venue or event and to attend any competitor briefing held for the event.

23. INSURANCE

23.1 Each Participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million per event or equivalent.

24. PRIZES

24.1 Details of prizes for each Class and Category will be provided before the first race and published on the ONB relevant to the event.

25. RIGHTS TO USE NAMES

25.1 Competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority and event sponsors without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event." You could add in event sponsors as well.
